Example: Steer

The winning buyer bids the highest amount of \$3.00 per pound on 1,000 pound steer. The buyer pays \$3,000 for that steer to the exhibitor through the fair. The monies for slaughter, cut and wrap are deducted from the exhibitors check issued by the fair. A standard 'Cut & Wrap' is used. The buyer may choose to specify differently on the form. The buyer will be notified when the meat is available for pick-up at the fairgrounds.

Example: Swine

The winning buyer bids the highest amount of \$4.00 per pound on 245 pound swine. The buyer pays \$980 for that swine to the exhibitor through the fair. The monies for slaughter, cut and wrap are deducted from the exhibitors check issued by the fair. A standard 'Cut & Wrap' is used. The buyer may choose to specify differently on the form. The buyer will be notified when the meat is available for pick-up at the fairgrounds.

Example: Re-Sales

The winning buyer has the option to not take the product (meat). They may place the market animal back up for auction (re-sale) with the privilege to determine where the second proceeds go in benefit of a program or specific youth. The second highest bidder would pay for the sale and receive the product. Re-sales may continue until a buyer takes product.

The Youth Livestock Show & Auction is held each year at the Martin County Fair to provide the 4-H/FFA exhibitors with an opportunity to present their market animal projects to our community. Market animal projects are auctioned on the last Saturday of the fair.

For the exhibitor, the Livestock Show & Auction is a culmination of several months spent working with their animal and learning within their 4-H Program or FFA Chapter to produce a quality meat product.



The swine or steer market animals available for purchase are high-quality, project animals. The 4-H/FFA exhibitors purchase quality stock, use high-quality feed and nutritional supplements with greater veterinary attention than normally required. They learn experientially through expert educators and resources adhering to industry standards. Those efforts are to produce the best possible market animal project.

The exhibitors also have a great amount of time, care and finances invested in their market project animal.

Our wish for the public and potential buyers is to recognize the efforts 4-H/FFA members put into their projects by supporting them during the Livestock Show & Auction. Many of the exhibitors use the monies received for continuing projects and for higher education goals.

Benefits as a Buyer

When purchasing a market animal during the auction, your purchase, amount payable to MCFA is considered is tax-deductible

Buyers, in addition to receiving a highquality meat product, also encourage an exhibitor to continue future projects and pursue their educational goals, with this financial support.



We do not use exhibitors to show our animals. We use projects to showcase our exhibitors.

Receipt of Meat

Arrangements for processing the meat are made by the Martin County Fair Association, Inc. As a buyer you are responsible for the cost of the 'cut & wrap' expenses. You will be notified of the meat delivery date for pick-up at the fairgrounds arena.

100% Charitable Resale

As a buyer you have the option during the auction to donate the market animal purchased back as a resale. As owner you may designate the second sale amount to the 4-H Association, FFA, or to an exhibitor.

As the first buyer, your bid amount goes to the original exhibitor as their supporter. The second buyer pays your designated recipient and owns the meat or they may choose to offer the project for resale again. All sales are payable the night of auction to the MCFA for disbursement to exhibitors or programs.

Add-ons

Any dollar amount can be given to a market exhibitor as an add-on. A form is available on the website. **Deadline: February 23, 2023.** All add-ons are tax-deductible.
